II. Description of the emergency situation:

The population residing in the surrounding areas of the Tanganyika Lac, precisely in the communes of Muhuta in Bujumbura rural and Rumonge in the Province of Rumonge experienced Sunday 29th March and 4th April, 2015 nights one of the most heavy rain falls and thunder ever in history. At least 19 persons are reported disappeared and injured after storms and landslides hit the outskirts of the Muhuta and Rumonge Communes. People of all ages including children have been affected. Report (from victims and local Administration) states that 2300 households are affected in Muhuta commune and 782 people in Rumonge Commune among them 48 men, 48 women, 158 boys, 202 girls, 8 widows men, 18 widows women, 300 young students in primary school of Vumbaganya among them 135 are boys and 165 girls. In total 660 households are without shelter. Household equipment including kitchen items, clothes, chairs, radios, school material and other belongings were swept away. This disaster has affected the poorest population of the society and hence the most vulnerable to such a torrent not predicted rain.

In addition to the above disasters also social infrastructures such as roads, 2 bridges destroyed, and public facilities like 4 schools, 1 health center, 2 Churches and solar powers, trees and plants are also affected. Main crops, like beans, cassava, sweet potatoes, beans, nuts etc were swept away at 85% while small domestic animals were also swept away at 100%.



The population touched by the natural disaster has lost their already few belongings as well as their homes. Those who cannot find shelter with other families or relatives are condemned to live under plastic sheets, while others have been lodged by friends, churches or various social centers. Four water tanks have been destroyed preventing potable water to communities. Four schools are destroyed and toilets are completely also destroyed. This disaster has also caused a landslide of 6 hills of Muhuta and Rumonge Communes causing the destruction of the crops, 660 houses and the death of the 19 people who lived there. The

affected hills are Mubone, Rutunga, Nyaruhongoka (Nkuba), Nyanguhwe in Muhuta Commune and Vumbaganya in Rumonge Commune.

The weather forecast reports that this heavy rain will continue. The Burundi Government and police rescue unit has been working on life saving, evacuation of stones, lands, trees in main road. They report that the victims are mostly children and elders.

Geographic areas are: Muhuta and Rumonge Communes in the hills listed above. The main rivers who broth stones, trees and other woods are Nyaruhongoka, Kavugangwe, mahamba, Gahoma, Rutunga and Kijejete in Muhuta commune and Cugaro in Rumonge Commune.
